



Makaye InfoSec and Imani Bridges



Imani Bridges is a non-profit organization created to serve as a strategic mobilization agency and implements collaborative community and economic development initiatives. They have been operating since 2014 in Badagry (Nigeria), where they run a Transformational Engagement Center. With the Covid-19 pandemic, the families started to face financial hardships that prevented them from accessing healthcare services. As a result, Makaye InfoSec and Imani Bridges teamed up to implement a medical outreach.

The event took place from the 15th to the 17th of December. To reach more community members in Badagry, Imani Bridges divided the campaign into three different locations: Transformational Engagement Center, the Cathedral of St. Thomas, and the Wil-Wil orphanage.

From the MEDI-AID program, we are proud to say that we reached 629 community members. Volunteers handed sanitizer and face masks to all participants upon arrival to follow the safety protocols. As Kathy Dudley, President of Imani Bridges stressed "access to healthcare is difficult in this region, we have many people with critical conditions that need support and assistance." During medical consultations, participants had access to medication for illnesses, such as malaria, hypertension, arthritis, and diabetes mellitus.




Apart from challenges to access healthcare, the Bagadry community also deals with food security issues, especially among widows. Widows are among the most vulnerable groups in Nigerian society due to the patriarchal structure of their society. They become a marginalized group and often struggle with finding a job and a place to live. The plight of widows in Nigeria has become a serious social issue. Without a husband, they lose financial aid, access to inheritance, and can lose child custody. Given this scenario, our efforts also centered on assisting this group. The event for widows reached 934 community members, all of whom received food parcels.

Due to financial strain caused by the pandemic, families did not have the means to provide school supplies to their children, which prompted our campaign to tackle this front as well. Following the safety protocols, the event benefited 769 children. Education is one of the pillars of our mission, and ensuring that participants have the necessary tools to study is of paramount importance.

This campaign has brought us great insights into the challenges the Badagry community faces in its path to sustainable development. The next step now is to keep developing our alliance with Imani Bridges and tackle roadblocks!



Makaye InfoSec and Joy Divine



Joy Divine Children's Organization is a Kenyan nonprofit with more than 15 years of expertise dedicated to providing education, shelter, and nutrition to the Huruma, Mathare, and Kiboro communities in Nairobi. With the Covid-19 pandemic, medical centers have centralized their efforts to treat infected people, leaving patients with other medical needs aside. This issue is particularly problematic in countries from the Global South, where poverty and malnutrition rates are higher than in other parts of the world. In this spirit, GXA, Makaye InfoSec, and Joy Divine joined forces to bring medical assistance to the Huruma community.

The medical outreach (MEDI-AID) too place between the 21st and 23rd of December. To reach the maximum number of community members, Joy Divine spent the two first days in specific regions and the third in different areas.

We are proud to say that we reached 1,635 community members, being 500 children, 1135 adults. Upon arrival, each community member received a face mask and a hygiene kit. After, volunteers divided participants into three groups for medical attention: priority, mid risk, and low risk. During each medical consultation, participants received medicines for various conditions, such as diabetes, asthma, and hypertension. As Frederick Mwaura, Executive Director of Joy Divine, explains: "People in these regions usually do not have access to medicines or medical care because of the high costs. Events like this definitely make an impact on community members' lives."



Apart from the lack of access to medical care, food security is still an issue within these regions. At Makaye InfoSec, we work to bring a sustainable approach to the development projects we implement with our partners. Before executing a project, we need to understand the needs and struggles of each community we help. **Our ultimate goal is to bring a holistic approach to our projects**. In this spirit, our campaign also distributed meals to participants. As Frederick highlights, "Families are hungry. With cases like this, we have many issues to tackle at once. We need a comprehensive view of our problems."

Accordingly, our campaign also sought to create new opportunities for locals, as our event relied on local artisan women to make the masks. At Makaye InfoSec, we believe that community members must participate in the sustainable development of their communities. The best way to achieve that is by using local labor is the best way to contribute to the economy and employment.

Finally, this campaign also gave us new insights into the struggles and issues these communities face. With all the knowledge we have gathered, we are ready for 2021 and all the projects to come!



Get To Know Our Heroes!




